Note "18" SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES FORMING PART OF ACCOUNTS

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in India, the Accounting Standards notified in the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 (CASR) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956.

1.2

The preparation of the financial statements, in conformity with the generally accepted accounting principles, requires estimates and assumptions to be made, that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Differences between actual results and estimates are recognised in the period in which the results are known/materialise.

Revenue Recognition 1.3

Software Services:

Revenues from software solutions and consulting services are recognised on specified terms of contract. Revenue from sale of products including sale of Software User Licences are recognized, when delivery to the customer has occurred. In case of multiple element contracts involving products and services, revenue is recognised on proportionate completion basis except where individual components are separable products or services that can be dealt with on standalone basis in which case revenue in respect of each component is recognized separately, as

Provisions for estimated losses on such engagements are made during the year in which a loss becomes probable and can be reasonably estimated. Amount per the terms of the contract.. received or billed in advances of services performed are recorded as unearned revenue. Unbilled services included in Current Assets, Loans and Advance represent amount recognised based on services performed in advance of billing in accordance with contract terms.

Interest Income is recognised on time proportion basis.

1.4

Fixed assets are valued at cost of acquisition less accumulated depreciation, amortisation and impairment, if any. Cost includes all expenses incurred for acquisition of assets

Depreciation on Fixed Assets is provided on straight-line method based on the estimated useful lives of the assets as determined by the management. The

Foreign Currency Transaction / Translation 1.6

Transactions in foreign currency are recorded at the original rate of exchange in force at the time transactions are effected. Exchange differences arising on repayment of foreign currency liabilities are recognized in the Profit and Loss Account.

Monetary items denominated in foreign currency are restated using the exchange rate prevailing at the date of the Balance Sheet and the resulting net exchange difference is recognized in the Profit and Loss Account.

Employee Benefits 1.7

a. Post employment benefits and other long term benefit plans

Company's contribution to defined contribution retirement schemes viz. contribution to the Federal pension plans is charged to Profit and Loss account.

The undiscounted amount of short term employee benefits expected to be paid in exchange for the services rendered by employees is recognized as an expense during the period when the employee renders those services. These benefits include compensated absences such as leave expected to be availed within a year.

accome Taxes are accounted for in accordance with Accounting Standard 22 on "Accounting for Taxes on Income", (AS 22) notified by the Central Government Taxes on Income under the Companies (Accounting Standandards) Rules, 2006. Tax expense comprises both current tax and deferred tax. Current tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid or recovered from the tax authorities using the applicable tax rates. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are recognised for future tax consequence attributable to timing difference between taxable income and accounting income that are measured at relevant enacted tax rates. At each balance sheet date the Tompany reassesses unrealised deferred tax assets, to the extent they become reasonably certain or virtually certain of realisation, as the case may be.

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Impairment of Fixed Assets 1.10

At the end of each year, the company determines whether a provision should be made for impairment loss on fixed assets by considering the indications that an impairment loss may have occurred in accordance with Accounting Standard (AS-28) "Impairment of Assets" notified by the Central Government under the Companies (Accounting Standandards) Rules, 2006. Where the recoverable amount of any fixed assets is lower than its carrying amount, a provision for impairment loss on fixed assets is made for the difference.

Intangible Assets 1.11

Internally generated Intangible assets arising from development activity is recognised at cost on demonstration of its technical feasibility, the intention and ability of the Company to complete, use or sell it; only if it is probable that the asset would generate future economic benefit and the expenditure attributable to the said assets during its development can be measured reliably. Intangible assets are carried at cost less accumulated amortisation and accumulated impairment losses, if any.

1.12

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognised when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources. Contingent liabilities are not recognised, but are disclosed in the notes. Contingent assets are neither recognised nor disclosed in the financial statements.
